

The work of CICS has continued to grow over these 12 months. In Secondary schools we have increased our commitment in some schools in order to deepen our relationships with the youngsters, and had opportunities in new schools where our team has been welcomed in to run Question Point as well as lessons, mentoring and assemblies (and even presenting an award at the schools Awards Night!).

We have also revisited the Its Your Move distribution including making links with the Calderdale transition scheme. It was great to hear some feedback from parents who said that Its Your Move really helped their children as they moved from primary to secondary.



The Question Point is a great way of connecting with hundreds of young people every week. When the Manchester bombing happened our Question Point teams were available to listen to young people involved which helped them with the healing and coping process.



Some of our trustees worked with Churches in Mytholmroyd and Hebden Bridge to create a 'Cragg Vale LifePath' and were part of the Scripture Union 150 scheme.

In Primary Schools we have supported more Open The Book schemes to start up - it is great when a local church is able to connect with local schools in this way.



CICS ran a very successful 'Raising Children and Young People in the Digital Age' evening with Dr Bex Lewis. This evening helped parents, teachers, school staff, carers and youth workers understand the world of social media and the different ways young people use this world.



4 workers and trustees went to the Houses of Parliament to receive the 'Inspire Award' for Children/Youth Initiatives.

The other day someone asked me if the number of schools CICS was at work in was decreasing. I answered that no, it was the opposite - we have more opportunities than time available. Schools welcome our teams in and are always keen for us to do more than we can offer.

This is an exciting time for CICS and this Annual Report is a snapshot of the amazing ways we join with what God is doing in schools. Thank you for your prayers, support, finances and investment.
